NAME THAT BIRD!

Southwest Louisiana is a bird lover's paradise, with 89 percent of Louisiana's total 456 bird species being recorded in Calcasieu and Cameron Parishes. Be on the lookout for Barred Owls, Red-bellied Woodpeckers, American Crows, Carolina Chickadees and Carolina Wrens here at Holbrook Park.



COASTAL ROOTS

In the spring of 2009, Bishop Noland Episcopal Day School in Lake Charles received 800 seedlings from the LSU Coastal Roots Program. The students oversaw the entire growth cycle and once the seedlings were ready to be planted, they transferred them to Holbrook Park. All 800 seedlings survived the transplant and now provide shade for park visitors.

To see additional bird species, consider visiting Intracoastal Park in Sulphur, Calcasieu Point Landing in Lake Charles or Lorrain Park in Hayes.
